COVER CAR: The 1955 Chevrolet

If you haven't seen or heard Carol McDade's 55 Chevy around Sun City, you're not paying enough attention. Carol says: "This '55 has been with Tom and Carol since they dated in it 47 years ago. The sound of that engine is what keeps Carol putting all the miles on it while Tom, an aircraft mechanic, does all the maintenance and makes this 327 turn heads. Second owner of the Arizona car, previously owned by Tom's roommate at Luke AFB, Tom put Dart2 heads on 25 years ago. Front brakes, Stainless steel exhaust and Traction bars for my birthday 20 years ago. My Christmas present for 2014 was new headers. The Car has lived with us in New York, Pittsburgh, Boston and Glendale and been in graduations, parades, weddings, proms and funerals." Their four children and thirteen grandchildren love this ride." The 1955 Chevy was a giant success for General Motors. Soon after its introduction, the 55 was quickly dubbed "the hot one" with the public flocking to dealerships to get a look at the new car. Over 1.7 million 1955 Chevrolets were produced, accounting for an amazing 23% share of all cars sold in the US for that model year. Although Chevrolet was already the top-selling car for several decades prior to 1955, Chevrolet's appeal was mostly to older drivers. Once introduced, the 1955, Chevrolet had mass appeal. The '55's light weight (3,200 lbs) combined with its powerful new V8 engine and popular shoe-box body design also made it a hit in hot rodding circles and soon after, collectors. The 55 would also put Chevrolet into the motorsports arena for the first time where it would win many races.

Speaking of V8's, the '55 Chevy was the first successful Chevrolet to be offered with an optional V8 engine. A little known fact is that Chevrolet produced a V8 in 1918, for their Chevrolet Series D, which produced 55-horsepower with it's 288-cubic-inches. However, that V8 only remained in production for one year. The new 265 cu in V8 for 1955 was available in 3 different configurations. There was the 162 HP; the 180 HP known as the "Power Pack" and the 195 HP, a late release known as the "Super Power Pack" engine. It's very cool to have Carol's wonderful example of the 55 Chevy Bel Air 2 Dr Hardtop, in our club. By the way, Baxley is also the proud owner of 55 Chevy!
