Featured Member Spotlight – Glenn Gormley



Glenn was born and lived the first 6 and a half years of his life in Patterson, NJ. In August of 1964, he and his family moved to Phoenix, AZ. His father had arthritis and really struggled with the cold weather, so they sold

everything, packed everyone up in their brand-new Country Squire Station Wagon, and off they went to the warm dry climate of Arizona.

Arriving in Arizona, Glenn's father quickly found a job and within a month, they had purchased a home and were living in the far West Valley community of Maryvale. Glenn attended Starlight Park Elementary School and, in his words, "just had the best childhood." Glenn laughs, "it was just wonderful out here, so much to do, we ran wild."

As a youngster, Glenn found he was always around things that had an engine, thus began his fascination with motorized vehicles. At the age of 10 or 11, Glenn got his "Taco" brand mini-bike; he rode it everywhere. After graduating from Junior High, Glenn worked a summer for his uncle Bill Gormley and saved up to buy a new 125 cc race ready Yamaha Motorcycle. This started the racing bug in Glenn as he competed in Motocross with his new motorcycle; and rode motorcycles throughout High School.

When he turned 16, he purchased his first truck; a 1968 Chevrolet Step-Side pickup. He followed that with a 1959 VW that he purchased for the enormous sum of \$25!

Glenn was a hard worker in school as well. In the West Valley, development was booming and the school system could hardly keep up. Glenn was in a flexible school schedule at Maryvale High School where for his Freshman through Junior years, he doubled down and took extra classes. By the time he was a Senior, Maryvale High School was bursting at the seams and added a new, Trevor Brown High School. Glenn had taken so many credits in his first three years he arrived at his Senior year only needing one credit. Glenn's senior year was a breeze and he soon graduated from Trevor Brown High School.

Glenn's father and uncle were in the ice cream business, selling ice cream all around the West Valley. Glenn worked for the ice cream warehouse all through High School; and although he had good grades and easily could have gone to the college of his choice following High School; he chose to

strike out on his own. He decided he needed to explore the world, and so he did.

He converted a 1964 Studebaker Step Van, a former postal vehicle, into an ice cream truck, and started an ice cream route of his own. Never really satisfied with that, he started looking for something else to do.

Soon after, he got married, and was a father at 20 years old. Glenn has two children, a boy, and a girl. He got a job as a salesman for a company, starting out as a shipping clerk. A sales manager took Glenn under his wing and he went into sales; he just excelled.

At Thanksgiving, his wife's uncle, Dick Byrnes asked him, "what do you want to do with your life?" He suggested, consider getting into the garbage business, "you'll never be out of work"! He thought he would give it a try and was referred to Dick's friend, Bob Allen of Western Waste Services. When Bob said he could use someone to clean his damaged trash containers, they would then need to find someone to come in to make welding repairs to them, and finally, find someone to paint them. Glenn said he could clean, weld, and paint them. Bob said Well, let's see what you can do. Bob was impressed with Glenn's work! He was given the job, and offered \$250/week. A pretty good wage in 1976.

When Bob was short a driver, he asked Glenn, "Do you think you could drive one of these trucks?" Glenn responded, "I am already driving them around the yard!" Another opportunity had presented itself, so Glenn jumped in and was rewarded with another raise.

Nine months later, Glenn was offered an opportunity to advance himself at Waste Management. He worked there, for 13 years, in a variety of positions, from sales to operations. In 1985 he had a serious, on the job, accident after blowing a front tire. While recovering, in 1986, since he was not yet fully able to return to his driving job, he started in a sales position at Waste Management, and once again, found, he excelled in sales. In 1988 he applied for a new position in Operations, and did not get the job due to his lack of a college degree.

Glenn decided to move on and put in his two weeks' notice, leaving the company without a job at that time. Shortly thereafter, Glenn ran into a gentleman that he had worked for in 1977, Joe Klimoski. Joe was starting a new company, and Glenn agreed to be his Operation's Manager, helping him build his company. In a few years this company was bought out by Waste Management.

Glenn had already started his own business, "Haul Away Clean-up Services," where he was helping people clean up their property, so he put in his two weeks' notice and went out on his own fulltime.

Glenn always had in his mind, that if he ever had his own business, his employees would not be treated as he had sometimes been treated in the corporate world. His employees would have a voice, he made it important for them to have the things that they needed to have success, and he always paid them the most he could afford to pay. "We had a blast every day!"

Through Glenn's excellent sales and business skills, he grew the company into a multi-million-dollar business. In 2006, he sold the company, and retired; Glenn was 50 years old. His working career had lasted 30 years and 2 months.

Over the course of his life, Glenn has focused on a couple of important points, he has “learned the art of communication with people” and has “learned to always have a couple of bucks in your pocket so you can take advantage of opportunities that come your way.”

Glenn loves cars, it has always been a constant in his life. Cars bring him great comfort. Glen says he “can’t count the hundreds of cars he has probably owned.”

Glenn was still racing, now he had switched to cars. He participated in Amateur Road Racing, covering primarily southern California and Arizona; Porsche was his main car of choice.

Over the years, Glenn had usually maintained a small collection of 4-6 cars. After the sale of his business, and with plenty of time to enjoy them, his collection grew to a huge number of cars. Glenn had a lot of Porsche's, Camaro's, VW's, Corvair's, etc.

Along with the racing, Glenn started a Consulting Company, helping friends and business associates make their businesses more successful.

In 2018, Glenn moved to Sun City to be closer to his mother and sister. He has been a member of the VVSC Club for about two and a half years. Being a high energy guy, he thought the Club would be a wonderful fit. His motto is “to help people, contribute to other’s success, and always have fun!”

Glenn’s current stable of cars include; 1956 Belvedere, 1965 Corvair Monza, 1966 Chevy II Nova, 1967 Camaro, 1984 BMW E30 325, 1995 BMW M3 Turbo Track Car, 1995 BMW M3 all original, 2003 BMW M3, 2000 BMW M5, 1924 Model T, 1976 911 Porsche, and a 1995 BMW 325i Sedan.

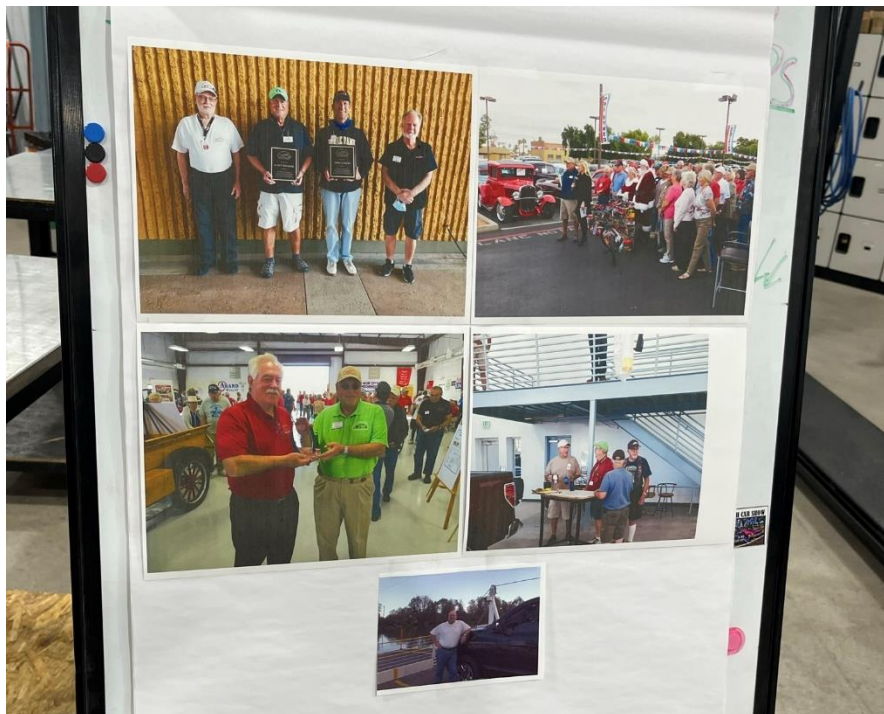



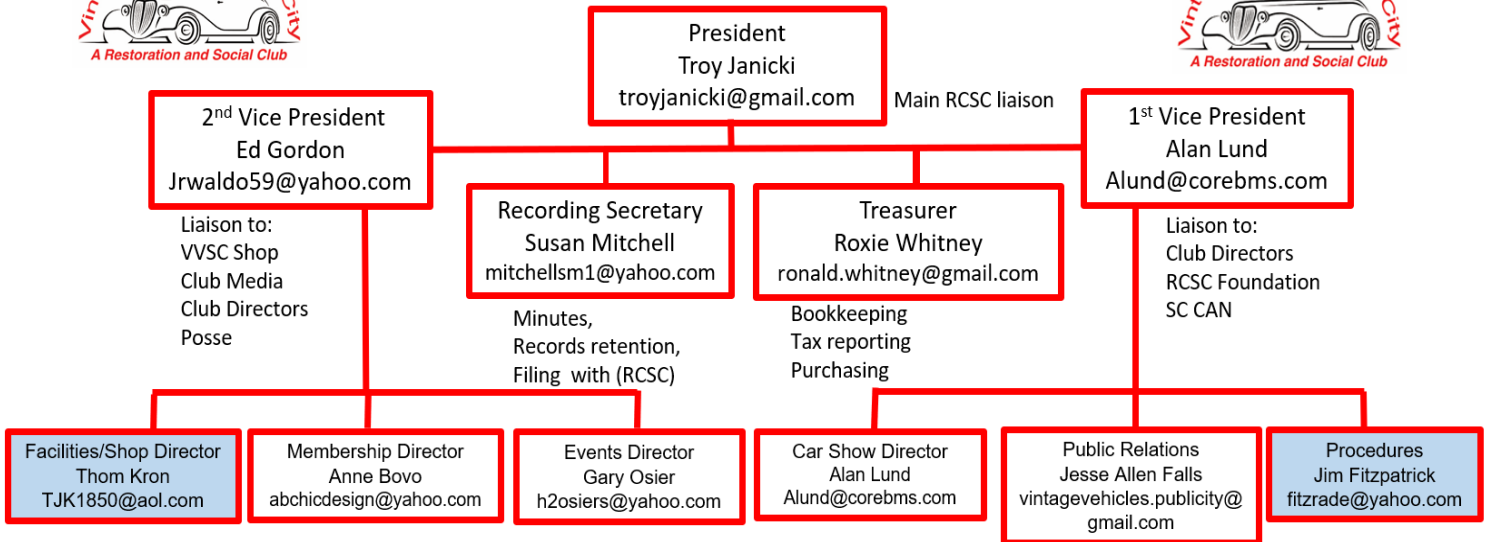
