Whether you can spare a few hours or commit to a regular shift, your support makes a difference. Let's bring the energy back and make this year's show unforgettable.





Shop Directions

Hello everyone, as we are slowly moving towards fall, I wanted to let you all know what is happening at the shop.

The 2 new lifts are in the shop, and we finally have all the axle jacks, and components that were purchased. The lifts are operational, and the RCSC has come to the shop, and evaluated the electrical system for problems. They have agreed to make the necessary changes (and hopefully the requests for power on the rear shop canopy wall).

We are still trying to get A/C in the shop. So far, RCSC (Mr. Wiprud) has not honored our request to talk to our contractors. These companies have already put effort into preparing a quotation. Mr. Wiprud was directed by interim general manager Mike Dirmyer to get quotations for the job. So far all we have heard is more excuses about why there is no progress in achieving this goal.

The new Square point of sale system is in place and is scheduled to go live the middle of September. More on this from the president, but we will be bringing groups through, and familiarizing people with the operation of the system.

There are lists of the current inventory posted on the door to the display cabinets for the shirts, hats, and other items. There are also posted lists on the top of the tubs under the stairs. These will help you locate the item you are looking for. We would ask that you modify the quantity as you remove an item from the location. The inventory is live in the square, but this keeps information current and saves time hunting in the wrong location.

The VVSC shop has been given a set of toolboxes by Chuck Phillips, and we will fill these out for use in the open bay in the weld shop.

Dennis David donated a toolbox with a lot of both general, as well as specialty motorcycle tools, for use in the motorcycle area.

Richard Poche bequeathed all his mechanical tools to the club when he passed away. This is allowing us to add additional toolboxes, so all the lifts will have boxes, and we are working to prepare another set for use out in the canopy area behind the shop.

Keep an eye out for emails about upcoming events and club meetings. Can't wait for car show season.



Riding High: Three Days Through the San Juans

A Journey of Scenery, Adventure, and Motorcycle Mishaps

Some rides are about the destination. This one was about everything in between. Ganon and I recently set out on a three-day motorcycle adventure that took us from the desert floor of Sun City, Arizona to the alpine majesty of Colorado's San Juan Mountains. Over 1,500 miles later, we returned with sore backs, full hearts, and more stories than sleep.

Day 1: Climbing into Colorado

We kicked off with a long haul to Ridgway, Colorado, climbing twice to over 10,000 feet—including a pass near the Telluride ski resort. The air thinned, the views expanded, and the road reminded us why we ride. But after a full day in the saddle, Ridgway's motel didn't quite deliver. So we pressed on to Montrose, where a newer hotel offered a slightly lower price and a "free" breakfast that felt like a small win.

Day 2: Closed Roads and Canyon Rewards

Bright and early, we returned to Ridgway, aiming for the Million Dollar Highway via Ouray—only to be stopped cold by a road closure from 8AM to 1PM. With five hours to spare, we reversed our loop and headed back to Montrose, detouring into Black Canyon of the Gunnison National Park. The steep black walls, the Gunnison River, and the Painted Wall cliff were stunning—but the real thrill was the twisty route in. From there, we followed US 50 along the Gunnison River and Blue Mesa Reservoir to CO 149, climbing toward Lake City for a well-earned lunch. It was scenic, winding, and peaceful—until South Fork, where my Harley threw up a temperature warning, followed by a check engine light. A quick call to the dealer suggested a radiator cap, fan, or pump issue. Fortunately, Harley's engines are air-cooled, with only the heads liquid-cooled to meet EPA standards, so we pressed on.

Wolf Creek Pass rewarded our perseverance with sweeping views, though traffic and construction between Pagosa Springs and Durango tested our patience. In Durango, we picked up US 550 for the legendary Durango–Silverton–Ouray run and finally got our Million Dollar Highway fix.

Day 3: The Long Way Home

Our return mirrored the outbound route—through Ridgway, Telluride, and Cortez—until the Indian decided to take a break, delaying us for a few hours. It was a fitting end to a trip where no day ended before midnight and no plan survived contact with the road.

Final Thoughts

Over three days, we climbed mountain passes, dodged closures, diagnosed engine quirks, and soaked in some of the most breathtaking scenery the Southwest has to offer. It wasn't perfect—but it was unforgettable.

If you're planning a ride through the San Juans, pack for altitude, expect the unexpected, and bring a friend who knows how to laugh when the check engine light comes on.




A new information manual has been created and is in the process of being refined as a reference primarily for new members, as well as existing members.
