Don't worry snowbirds. You will be put in archives but once you pay your 2026 dues you will be reinstated too.





No, most "Hot Rodders" are not Hoarders

There is a cultural overlap where collecting parts and cars is a common passion. The term "hot rod hoarder" is used both informally within the community and humorously to describe enthusiasts who accumulate a large number of cars and parts, often in a way that can become excessive and difficult to manage. However, this is a passion for collecting and preserving automotive history, distinct from the psychological disorder of compulsive hoarding, which involves overwhelming anxiety about parting with possessions and is a serious mental health issue.

- **"Hot rod hoarding" as a hobby:**


This typically involves passionate collectors who acquire a large inventory of rare or unique car parts and projects. For example, someone might buy old parts because they know they won't find them again or keep multiple project cars because they have a vision for each one.

- **Compulsive hoarding disorder:**

This is a recognized mental health condition characterized by difficulty discarding possessions, regardless of their actual value, leading to excessive accumulation and clutter that can impede the ability to use living spaces. The actions of someone with a hoarding disorder are driven by significant emotional distress, not just a love for a particular hobby.

- **The overlap:**

The line can blur between a passionate collector and someone who might be developing a hoarding disorder, especially when the collection becomes unmanageable or causes significant distress. However, the intent is different; a hot rod collector is often driven by a love for the hobby and potential future projects, while a person with compulsive hoarding is experiencing a mental health condition.
